Dual Language

Hawthorn School of Dual Language has approximately 400 students from kindergarten to fifth grade.
Our school is the only school that offers the Spanish/English Dual Language Program.

Our Mission

The Hawthorn School of Dual Language empowers students to achieve academic success and social and emotional well-being as they become bilingual, biliterate, and bicultural.

What is Dual Language?

The Dual Language Program is also known as a Two-Way Immersion Program. The Dual Language Program uses two languages for instruction, learning, and communication with the goal of becoming bilingual, biliterate, and bicultural

What does it look like?

- The classrooms are comprised of 50% bilingual Spanish-speaking students and 50% English-speaking students.
- Hawthorn School of Dual Language Program is modeled after the 50/50 model, which provides equal instruction in English and Spanish starting in Kindergarten.
- The curriculum, learning goals, and academic expectations are the same for any student in the district with the added benefit of learning in two languages.
